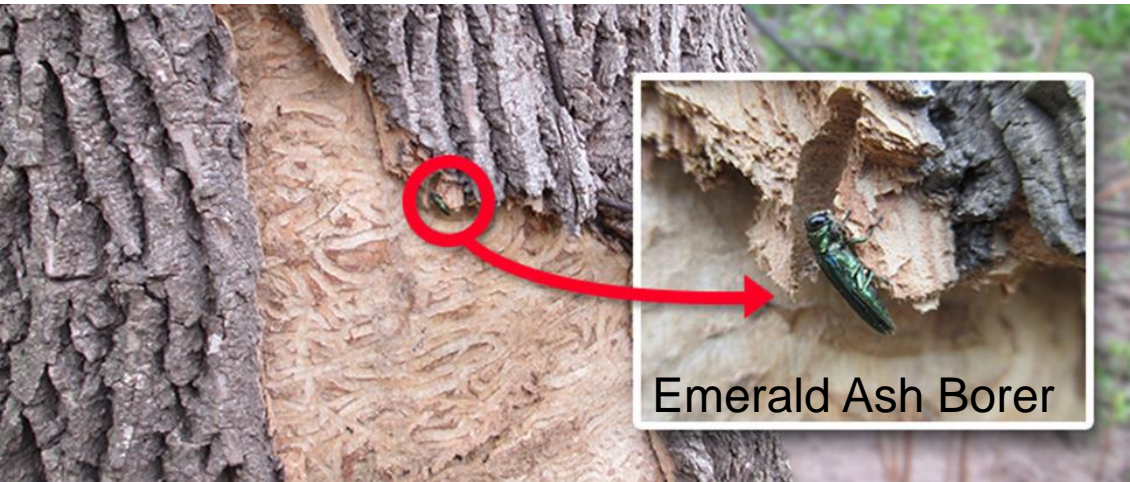

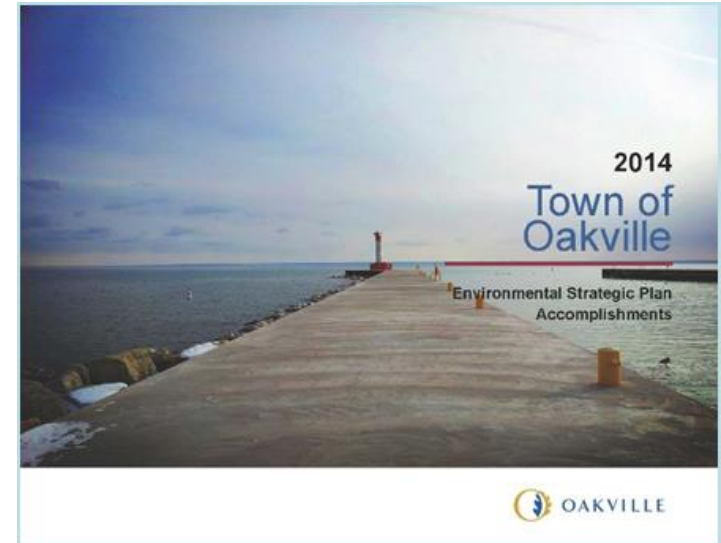
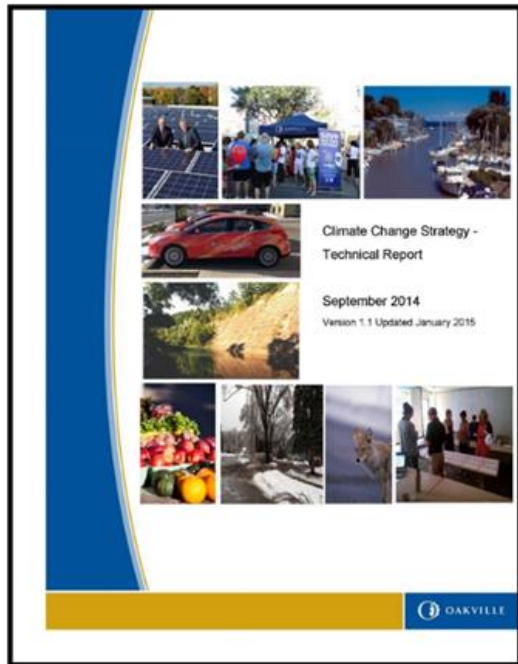

- 3: Monitor implementation of actions and goals to make continuous improvements

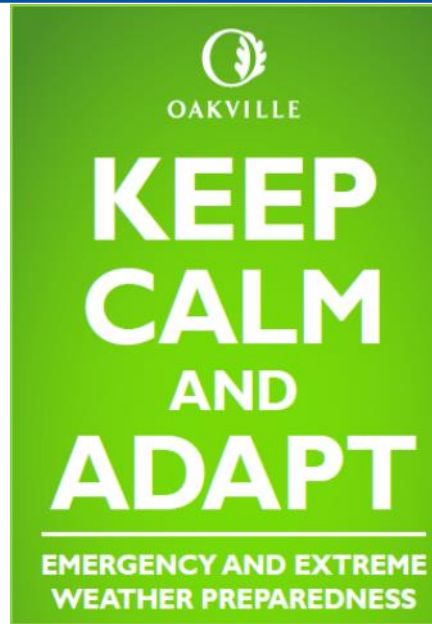
