

## Lots of Data and Information about the Waters in the Great Lakes Region






#### A Call for Better Information

- June 2013 Council of Great Lakes Governors and Premiers calls for a comprehensive approach to monitoring Great Lakes water resources
- January 2014 Bi-national workgroup formed:
  - Federal, state, provincial, industry, academic, NGO, ...
- April 2014 presented Blue Accounting report and recommendations to governors and premiers
- June 2015 Governors' Summit





#### **Getting Started**

- Information management platform a partnership between GLC and The Nature Conservancy
- Work has started on two initiatives:
  - Reconnecting river and streams
  - Monitoring aquatic invasive species
- New pilot in 2015: Safe and Sustainable Domestic Water Supply



#### Pilot: Domestic Water Supply

- Safe and sustainable domestic water supply
  - Issue: Delivering high quality water
  - Issue: Reducing energy cost to deliver water
  - Issue: Addressing aging infrastructure

#### Pilot status:

- Forming the Collaborative with water supply experts from across the basin
- Collaborative will define key questions behind the issues and corresponding metrics
