### ***In a time of crisis, Mayors helping Mayors***

Residents of Flint, Michigan continue to face high levels of lead in their drinking water, and Great Lakes mayors are stepping up to help during this time of crisis. The Cities of Sarnia, Windsor, and Hamilton, Ontario, as well as Evanston, Illinois, have donated bottled water or monetary funds to help with relief efforts. The three Ontarian cities have close ties to Flint - Hamilton is Flint's Canadian sister city, and both Sarnia and Windsor's junior hockey league teams frequently compete against Flint's junior league team. Said Mayor Mike Bradley of Sarnia, "This isn't just being a good neighbour. We've always reached out in times of turmoil and tragedy to other communities, so this is just part of that." The Cities Initiative has offered its assistance to Mayor Karen Weaver of Flint, and we continue to look for ways that the organization can best assist cities facing similar issues, both in the short-term and in the long-term.
