The Township has made major capital expenditures on its access points over the years however the largest expenditure is the docks and wharfs at Pointe au Baril. The fixed structures will be an issue if the water levels remain low or drop. Cost to make structures stable and usable will be significant as the wharf is the retaining wall for the local road. Part of these measurers will be dredging and blasting. Issue of channels will be another major issue and whose responsibility to ensure access to the various islands where ratepayers have cottages. The financial impact on the property values as well as the local economy that relies on these cottagers will be significant.
