Collingwood Public Utilities is pleased to announce a new service: the Quench Buggy— an environmentally responsible mobile water distribution system that supplies clean, sustainable municipal drinking water on-site for outdoor events.

Featuring eight water stations, two of which are designed to ensure barrier-free access, each station includes a tap for filling cups or bottles as well as a drinking fountain. The Quench Buggy can deliver water via direct connection to a municipal water supply outlet, or from the unit's holding tank. This tank has a volume equivalent to the quantity of water contained in 2,000 standard plastic water bottles. However, the drinking water in the holding tank costs a fraction of that of bottled water: Two thousand 500ml bottles of water would cost, at \$1.50 each, \$3,000. To fill the Quench Buggy based on the current consumption charge costs only \$0.59 (1 cubic metre equals 1000 litres).

In addition the Quench Buggy minimizes environmental impact, with solar panels that provide a sustainable source of electricity to pressurize the holding tank. Using reusable bottles ensures a waste-free supply of fresh, safe drinking water.
