5 Projects Chosen for Thames River Phosphorous Reduction Collaborative Funding

The Thames River Phosphorus Reduction Collaborative is a joint project of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture and the GLSLCI, to reduce phosphorus using innovative technologies installed at the edge of farmers' fields and in municipal drains. The overall goal is to help contribute to the binational target of 40% reduction in phosphorus loads in Lake Erie. We have hit two milestones in the project- we have chosen five technologies and identified the sites for installation. Next steps are installation, monitoring and outreach.


Government Draft Environmental Plan The draft Environment Plan is open for 60 days for

public comment. The plan discusses the need to continue work to protect the Great Lakes in the chapter on water, and proposes updating Ontario's Great Lakes Strategy. It also discusses reviewing Ontario's water taking processes, working to improve wastewater and stormwater management, including working with municipalities to increase transparency through real time reporting of sewage overflows. There are additional chapters on climate change, waste/litter and conservation and parks. GLSLCI will do a thorough review of the draft plan and submit comments by the January 28 deadline.
