Following recent modifications to the MARPOL and BWM international conventions, the Canadian government is in the process to modernize its rules regarding environmental impacts of shipping. The Cities Initiative was recently briefed on measures that will pose strict restrictions to sulfur (SOx) and particulates in fuel.

ty Agreement, a draft 2019-2023 Lakewide Action and Management Plan (LAMP) has been prepared for Lake Erie and the connecting St. Clair – Detroit River System. The draft LAMP was developed by the Lake Erie Partnership, a collaborative team of natural resource managers led by the governments of the United States and Canada, in cooperation and consultation with state and provincial governments, Tribal governments, First Nations, municipal governments, and watershed management agencies. **LEARN MORE**

Faster beach water warnings in

Great Lakes cities Day-of-testing protocol for testing beach water is the new method that releases test results to beaches by

noon. Lab members leave at 5 am and return at 8 am. Under the usual method, labs grow bacteria from water samples, a process that takes about 24 hours to show results. Racine, Wisconsin, was the first city in the U.S. to earn EPA approval for same-day analysis in 2012. For the sake of public health, other local jurisdictions and states across the country have considered switchingbut it's easier said than done. Chicago is the only major U.S. city to use a new method to test for bacteria at most of its beaches—and then issue same-day swimming advisories. This summer will be the first time that Michigan health departments can post notices from same-day results. **LEARN MORE** Dive deep into the Great Lakes
