


The Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative is an influential, positive presence in decision-making and actions related to the greatest freshwater resource in the world. Since its founding in 2003, the organization has provided a powerful, collective voice for our region's mayors and helped protect, restore, and sustain the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River and strengthen the economic vitality of the cities along their shores. The Cities Initiative's major accomplishments include:

- Forging a coalition of close to 150 mayors representing more than 17 million residents, spanning two countries, two provinces, and eight states all speaking with one voice
- Increasing the regional profile of member mayors and their municipalities and gaining recognition for their accomplishments in protecting the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River
- Leading federal funding initiatives in Canada and the United States for critically needed climate adaptation, water infrastructure, and erosion mitigation programs
- Drawing attention to the vital connection between environmental health and economic prosperity





## Over the years the Cities Initiative has influenced the policy agenda for the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River. Our accomplishments include:

- Action Plan to Protect the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence 2020-2030 – Collaborated with other regional organizations to recommend key initiatives to guide Canadian policy for the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River
- Invasive Carp Protection Worked collaboratively
  with the Great Lakes Commission and Great Lakes
  Fishery Commission to prevent Invasive carp and
  other invasive species from moving through the
  Chicago Area Waterway System between the
  Mississippi River basin and the Great Lakes
- Canada-Ontario Agreement Signed a
   Memorandum of Cooperation with the Ontario
   ministries of: Environment, Conservation and Parks;
   Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources,
   and Forestry; Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs;
   establishing a strategic partnership between
   municipalities and the Federal Government to
   collaborate on Great Lakes decisions
- Canada Water Agency Supported the creation of the new agency and contributed to the development of its policies and programs
- Economic Stimulus Secured \$350 billion for states and cities to replace lost revenue during the Pandemic
- Federal Funding Supported and obtained the following from our Federal Governments:

## Canada

\$1.4 billion to Infrastructure Canada to rehabilitate storm water systems and restore wetlands and shorelines, \$200 million for a new Natural Infrastructure Fund, and \$2.2 billion in additional monies for the new Canada Community-building Fund

## **United States**

\$55 billion for water infrastructure, including: \$15 billion to remove lead water lines, \$1 billion for the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative, \$1.5 billion to strengthen community resilience to natural disasters, \$6 billion to strengthen resiliency in coastal communities, and \$9.2 billion for water equity

- Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Helped create and sustain this highly successful restoration program, which has invested nearly \$4 billion to restore the Great Lakes, including cleaning up the most heavily degraded areas in Great Lakes cities
- Microbeads Encouraged the creation of laws banning plastic microbeads from personal care products, leading to a recent nationwide ban in the United States and in Canada
- Sustainability Implemented the Green Cities
   Transforming Towards Sustainability program
   (Green CiTTS) to promote and expand sustainable practices by providing training, funding, research opportunities, and demonstration projects focused on stormwater management, sustainable municipal water management, and climate adaptation and resiliency
- Water Conservation Framework Launched an effort to reduce water use in cities by 15% between 2000 and 2015, with members collectively reducing water consumption by 19%, saving over 123 billion gallons of water
- Water Equity Initiative Leading the way in strengthening water equity in some of the most under-served communities in our region by supporting a \$58 billion "Lead Safe Communities" fund and advocating for modernized water delivery to ensure affordable water for all residents in our region
