Local Power: Catalyzing the Transition to Clean and Renewable Energy at the Community Level

From hydropower and nuclear energy to community solar and geothermal, communities and utilities across the basin are pivoting away from fossil fuels to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve air quality and seek a cleaner, more resilient energy future.
