

Statement of Support for the Cities Initiative's Economic Transformation Action Plan

We, the undersigned organizations, welcome the release of the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative's *Economic Transformation Action Plan: A Blueprint for Economic Growth and Freshwater Stewardship in the Great Lakes & St. Lawrence River Region* and support its ambition of transforming our regional economy into a world-renowned Fresh Coast Economic Corridor.

Our region is home to 84 percent of North America's surface fresh water, which powers industries across our regional economy – the third largest in the world – and provides drinking water to more than 40 million people. As global water scarcity increases, we have a historic opportunity to bring new businesses and residents to our region. In preparation for this future, we must advance a new model of responsible economic development that protects our water quality and supply, futureproofs our businesses and communities and ensures economic benefits are broadly shared.
