JOB SUMMARY

The **Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative** is a leading multinational coalition of municipal and Indigenous leaders committed to driving economic prosperity while safeguarding the freshwater resources of the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River Region. Joining our team means stepping into a vibrant, fast-moving environment where you'll collaborate directly with mayors, senior municipal officials, and other influential decision-makers—alongside American and Canadian colleagues passionate about making a real difference.

The Cities Initiative is seeking an experienced project funding professional to join our team. The ideal candidate will have a proven track record securing funding for climate resilience and/or water quality improvement projects through government and foundation grant writing and knowledge of alternative financing (e.g. tax incremental financing). The role will support members in advancing on-the-ground projects that improve local resilience to flooding and erosion and/or improve water quality of the Great Lakes. This is a full-time, remote position reporting to the Chief Programs Officer and working collaboratively with the U.S. and Canadian teams. This position may be filled as contract (hourly) or employment (salaried).

MAJOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Direct Member Support (60%)

- Meet with members, including mayors and municipal staff, to understand financing support needs.
- Research and prioritize funding opportunities for members to advance local water quality improvement and climate resilience projects
- Develop strategic communications to targeted groups of members regarding available funding opportunities, ensuring they receive timely and accurate information such as grant objectives and dates/deadlines
- Prepare training materials and engage members through in-person and virtual meetings and workshops on financing for local water quality improvement and climate resilience projects
- Provide one-on-one financing support to members for advancing current projects aiming to improve water quality and/or climate resilience, including preparing grant applications to federal, state, provincial and foundation funding programs and developing financing strategies for alternative project financing for design, capital and matching costs
- Identify capacity constraints and recommend solutions for common funding challenges, including local capacity for grant administration
- Develop and foster partnerships with agencies, non-profit organizations and private sector partners to ensure optimal coordination and reduce duplication of efforts

Cities Initiative-Led Pilot Programs Support (30%)

- With Chief Programs Officer, evaluate member feedback and support the development of a suite of highvalue pilot programs that improve local climate resilience and water quality
- Research and prioritize funding opportunities to support Cities Initiative-led pilot programs and prepare grant applications to secure funding for pilot programs

Evaluation and Grant Reporting (10%)

- Provide regular updates to the Programs team on accomplishments to support grant and organizational evaluations
- Provide written documentation of activities and outcomes required for grant reports

- Strong organizational and project management skills
- Strong skillset in all Microsoft 365 programs, Constant Contact, email automation, WordPress, and Google Analytics
- Fluency in English
